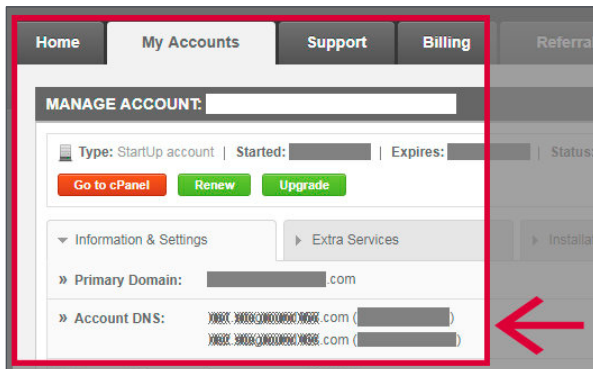
→ Point Name Servers



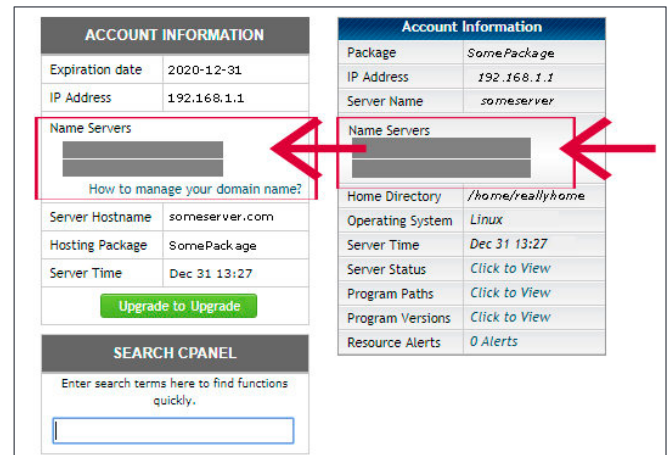
1. Find out what your host's name servers are

- In most cases, your DNS (**D**omain **N**ame **S**erver) information will have been sent in the welcome email you should have received from your new hosting company.
- You can also find this information a lot of times in the backend of your hosting provider or in the left sidebar of cPanel.

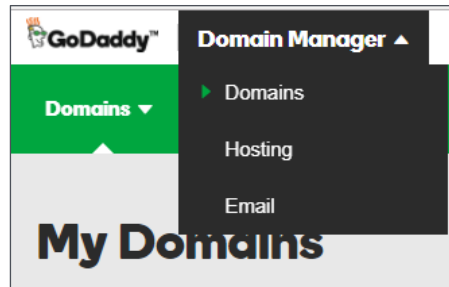

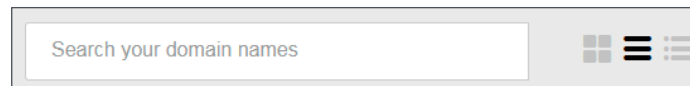
→ Point Name Servers

2. Enter the DNS server information into your Domain registrar's backend

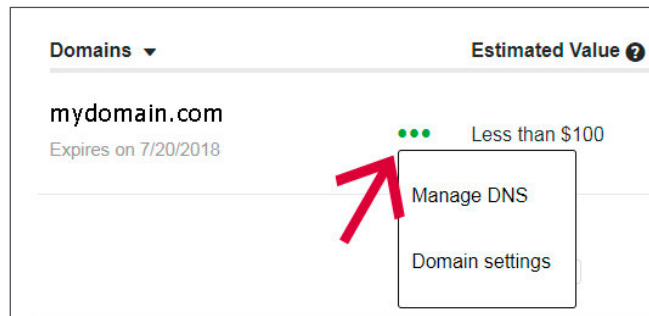
- How and where to enter this can be confusing to find. If in doubt, use their Help/Search function and look for "DNS management" or reach out to Support.
- The following applies to GoDaddy:
 - ☑ *log into your account, then select "Domains" from the dropdown in the top left corner next to the logo*



- ☑ *you will be taken to "My Domains"; be sure to look at your domains in "Simple List view" (3 parallel bars to the right of the search field)*



- ☑ *you should see your domain listed, and next to it 3 dots (ellipsis); click on them to reveal a drop-down menu; select "Manage DNS"*

- ☑ *the page you will see next looks confusing at first; simply scroll down until you see the "Nameservers" field; click on the "Change" button, then enter the name server information EXACTLY how it was given to you; make sure you are not entering any spaces; simply follow the prompts and accept your changes*
